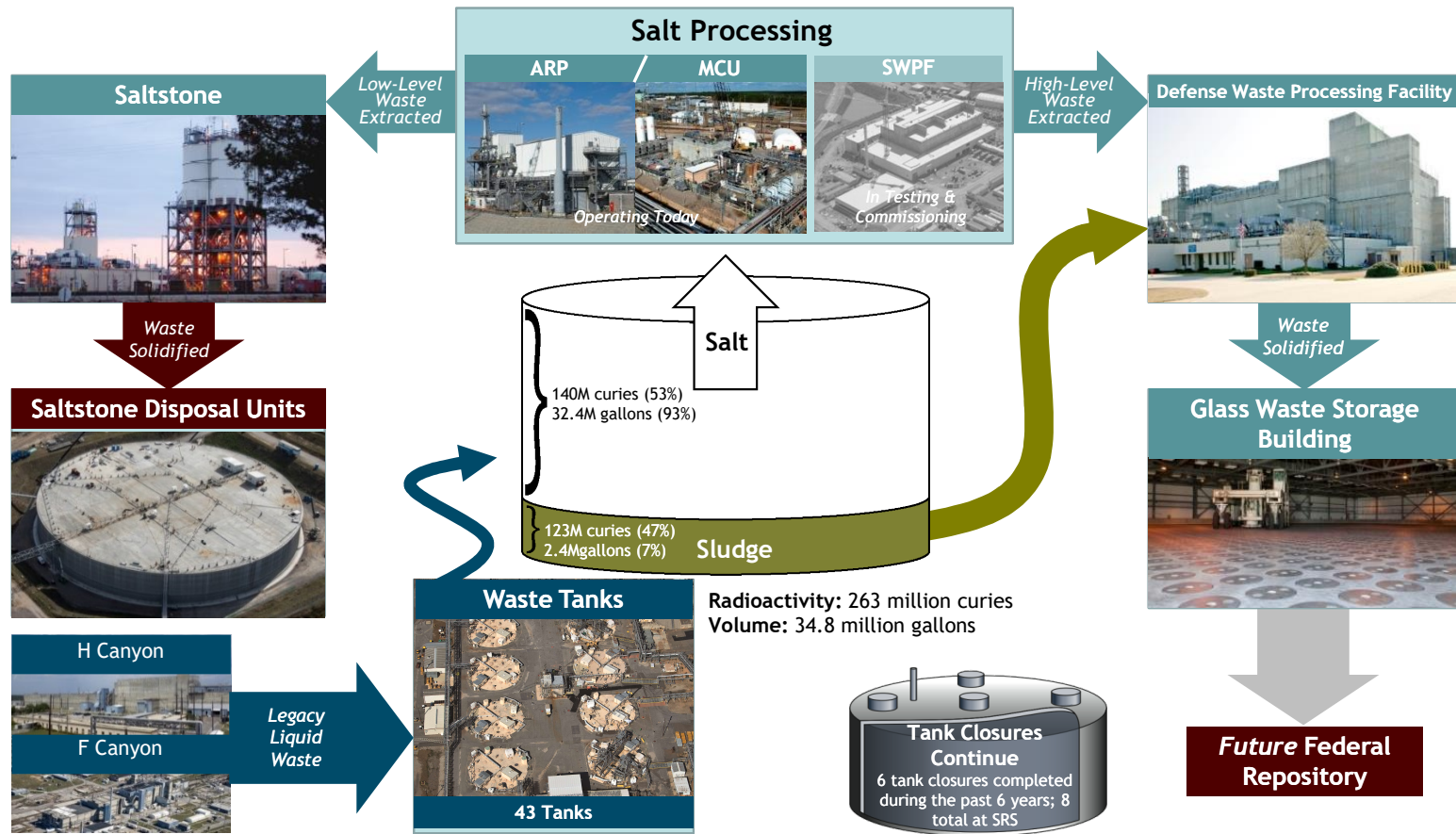


Savannah River Remediation Contract in Perspective



- SRR started the contract on July 1, 2009
- 6-year base contract, plus 2-year option, for high-level waste cleanup at SRS ending June 30, 2017
- DOE recently extended the contract to September 30, 2020
 - Current workforce of ~2,200 employees (including subcontractors)
- Focused on Liquid Waste Mission
 - High-hazard operations
 - Complex Engineering, Procurement, & Construction
 - Closing waste tanks

- SRR has awarded over \$733 million to Small Businesses which is 62.8% of all subcontract awards
- Over \$567 Million in subcontract awards have been made to the local area which includes Barnwell, Aiken, Allendale, Columbia and Richmond counties.

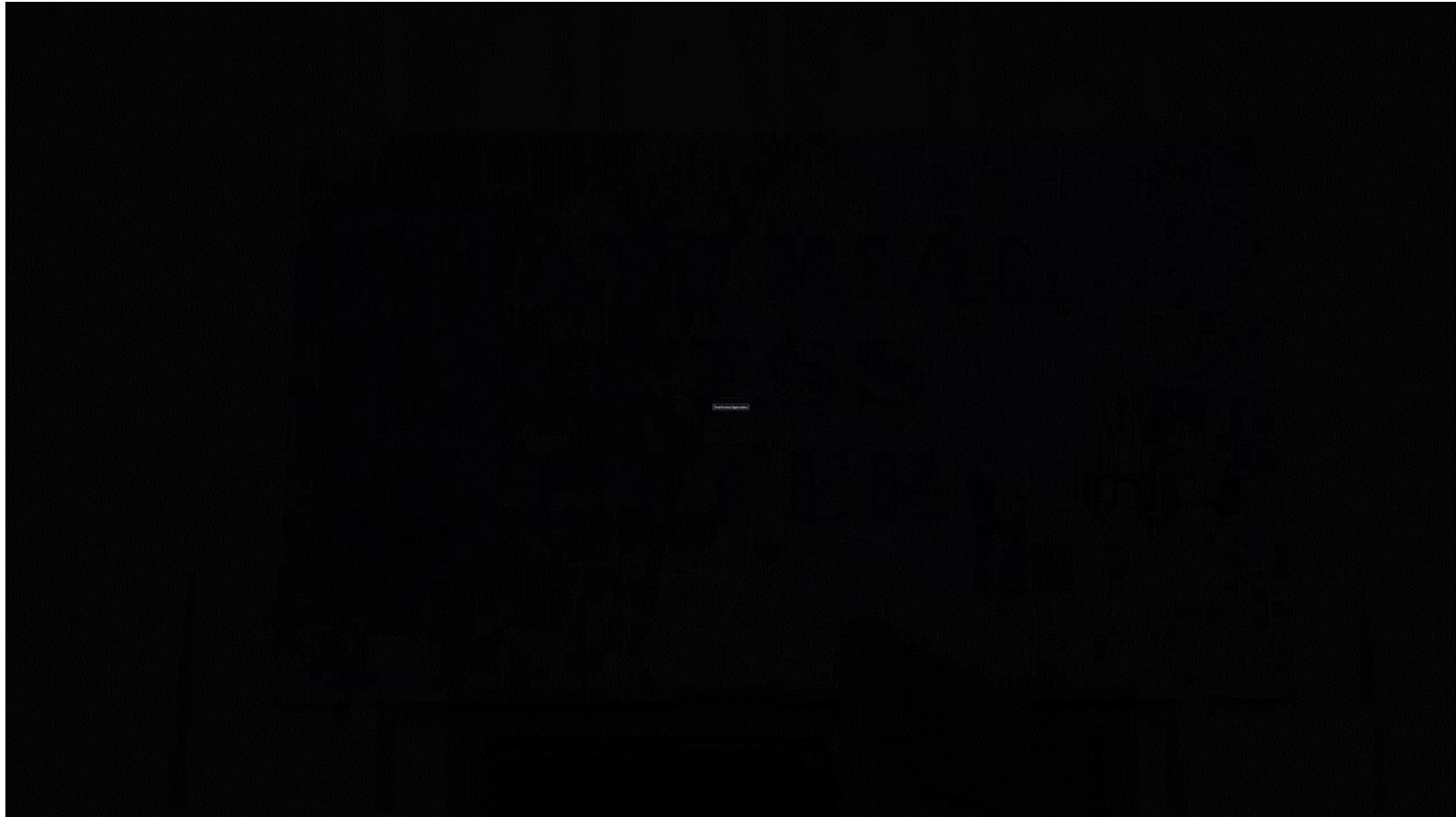

M&O Services and Staffing for MACs

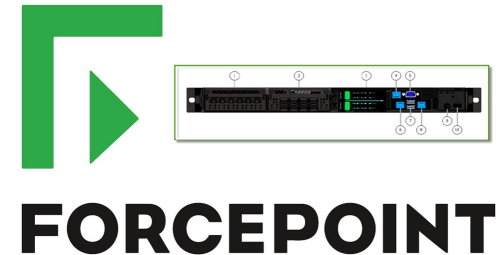

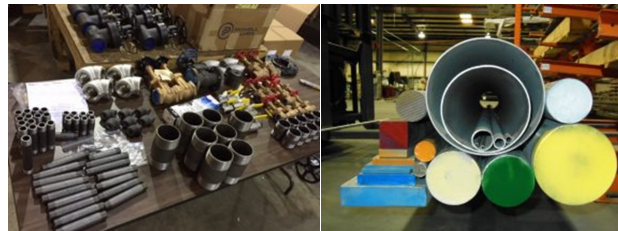
Strategic Agreements

- **How do I introduce my company to SRR?**
 - By contacting SRR's Small Business Program Manager, Elizabeth Wooten, who will connect you with the appropriate procurement personnel.
- **What is the best way to reach out?**
 - By sending an email with information about your company including capabilities and strengths. This email should also include any documents you would like distributed to procurement personnel.
- **How do I register with SRR?**
 - By completing SRR's Supplier Information Form and other applicable documents found on our website, <http://www.srremediation.com/business.html>, under Supplier Forms and Documents.
 - *Do I need to complete a Vendor Authorization EFT to register?*
 - You do not when registering for potential opportunities. It is required later if an award is made.
 - *Do I need to complete the SC Department of Revenue Nonresident Taxpayer Request (I-312)?*
 - Only if applicable, see document or Tax Code Section 12-8-550 for further details.
 - *Am I required to submit a W-9?*
 - Yes.

- **What opportunities are available with SRR?**
 - Some commonly procured goods and services include: communications equipment, analytical services, engineering and construction services, electrical and mechanical equipment, instrumentation and other specialized products.
- **How to become aware of contracting opportunities?**
 - SRR Buyers use our supplier registry, past performance, System for Award Management (SAM), the SBA's Dynamic Small Business Search and other sources to develop lists of suppliers to reach out to for procurement opportunities.
- **Does SRR advertise all procurement opportunities?**
 - No. Major projects may be posted on FedBizOpps.gov. A list of *Procurement Opportunities* are updated quarterly and available on our website, <http://www.srremediation.com/business.html>, under Other Documents. This list is not comprehensive.
- **Does a business have to be registered with the Federal Government to be eligible?**
 - Yes! In 2017, SRR changed our requirements. All businesses are required to be registered in the System for Award Management (www.sam.gov).

Focused outreach efforts will continue in 2019 with the following organizations:

- The Office of Small Disadvantaged Business Utilization (OSDBU) which provides maximum practical opportunities in the Department of Energy's acquisitions to all small business concerns.
- SCORE (Service Corps of Retired Executives) a resource partner with the U. S. Small Business Administration.
- The University of South Carolina Aiken's Small Business Development Center, a resource partner.
- The Small Business Administration representatives to determine how to better assist the small businesses managed by SRR.
- The Small Chain Management Center (SCMC) and Integrated Contractor Purchasing Team (ICPT) groups as resource partners.
