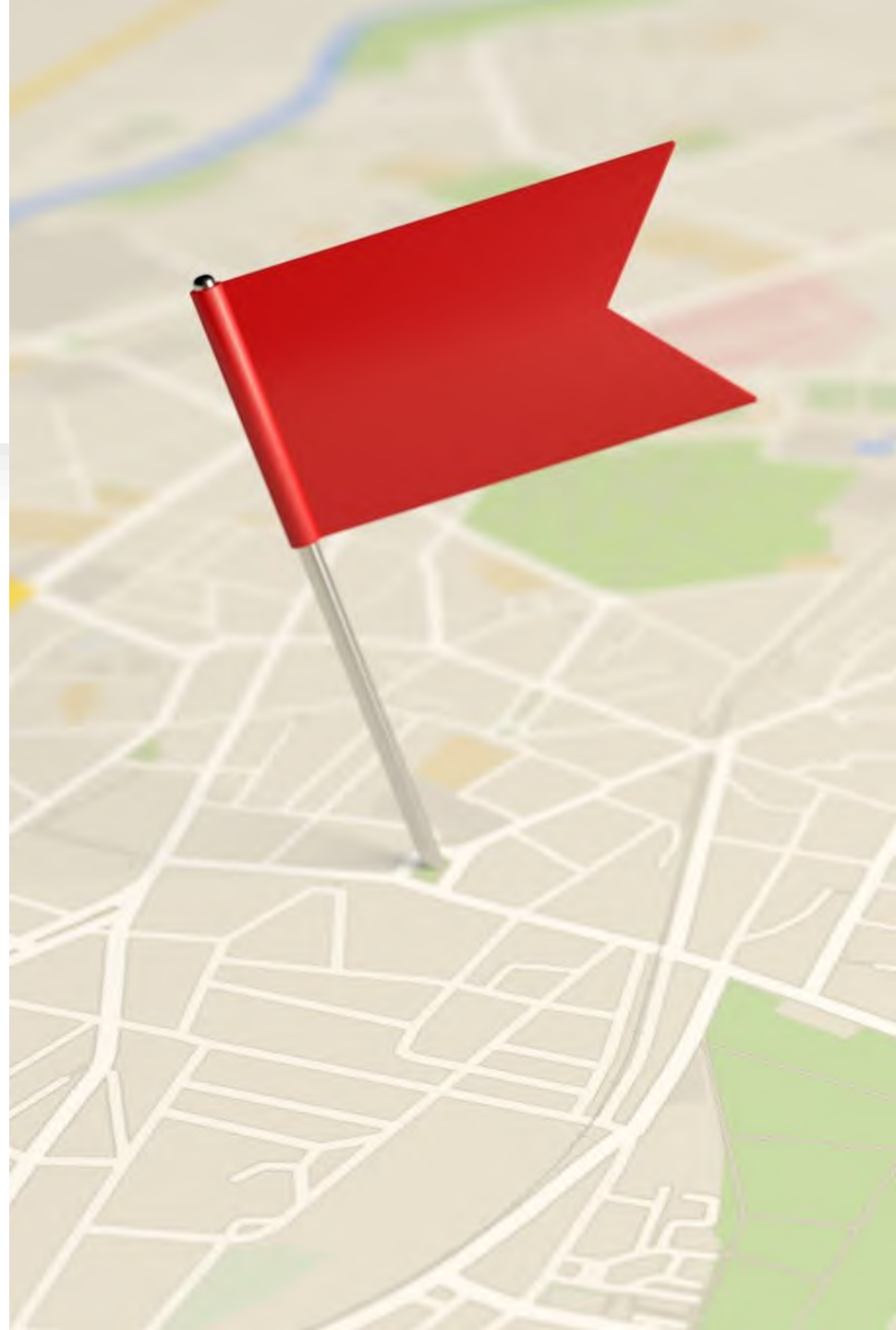

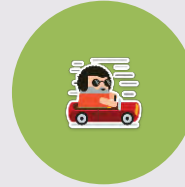

- Language barriers ≠ lack of sophistication



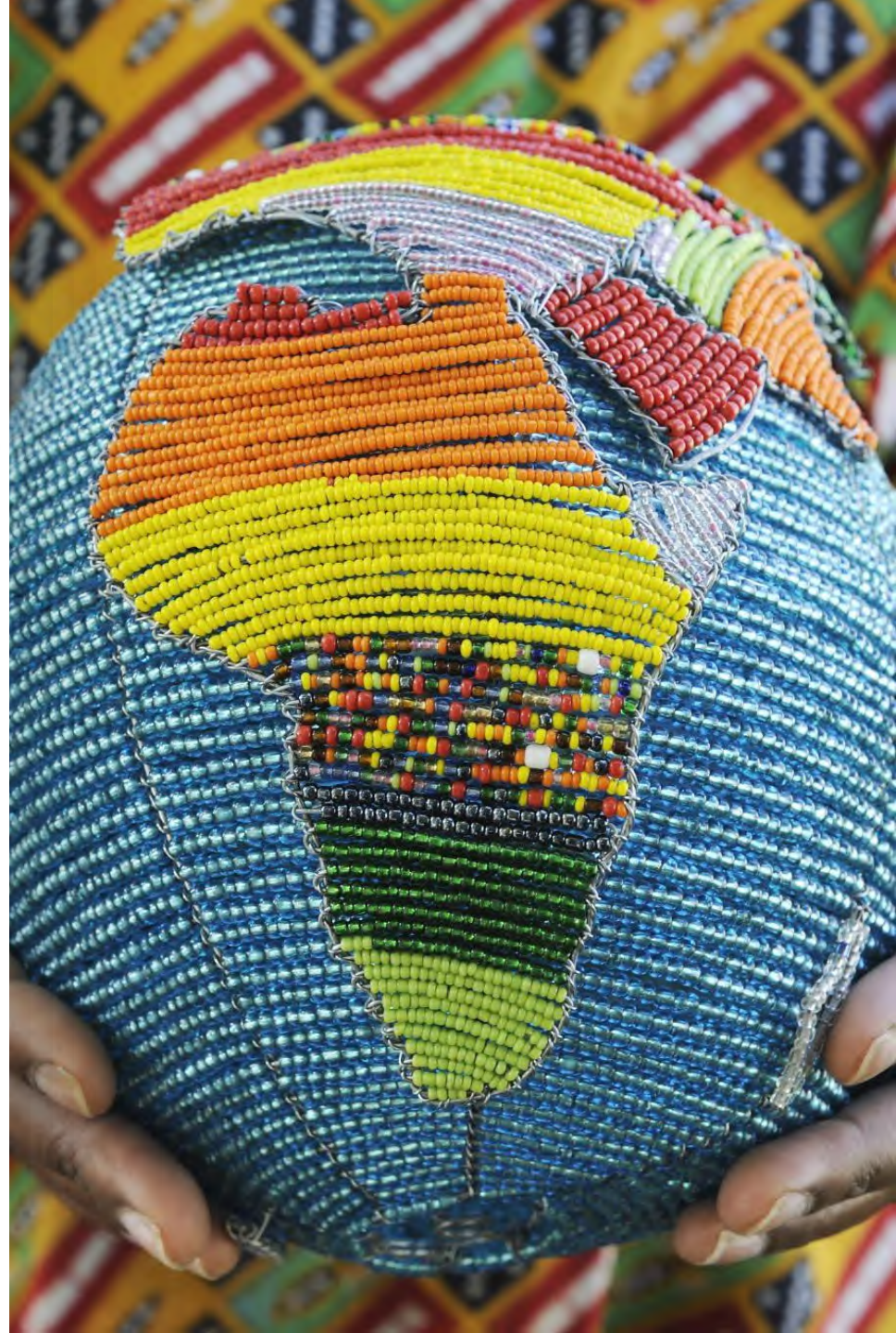
Argentina

Argentina's culture is a vibrant, predominantly Western blend of 19th/20th-century European (mainly Italian and Spanish) immigration and Latin American traditions. Defined by a passionate, social lifestyle, key pillars include sharing *Mate* tea, *Asado* (barbecue), Tango, soccer, and a strong family focus.



Algeria

- Algeria is largest African country
- Mostly Arab-Berber culture with Arabic being the primary language (some French)
- Some Africans so makes it a diverse country
- Football (soccer), handball, athletics, boxing, martial arts, volleyball and basketball are the most popular sports in the country





Tunisia – North Africa

- Tunisia (North Africa)
- 98% of the Tunisian people today are Arab or Arab-Berber
- Progressive but conservative society
- Passion for spicy food and soccer

Curaçao – Caribbean Island

Curaçao's culture is a vibrant, Afro-Caribbean blend with strong Dutch, Latin American, and Jewish influences, often described as "Dushi" (sweet). The islanders are laid-back and welcoming, speaking Papiamentu, Dutch, English, and Spanish. Key traditions include the massive Carnival celebration, the harvest festival Séu, and a love for music and colorful architecture



Ecuador – South America

Ecuadorian culture is a rich, multi-ethnic tapestry blending Indigenous, Spanish colonial, and African traditions, with a predominantly mestizo population. Deeply family-oriented and Roman Catholic, society values close-knit relationships, respect for elders, and vibrant festivals. Key elements include regional cuisine variations (coastal seafood vs. Andean potato dishes), musical styles like Pasillo, and, in many areas, the use of Kichwa alongside Spanish.





Netherlands – Europe

Dutch culture is characterized by direct communication, egalitarianism, and a high value on privacy, efficiency, and punctuality. Known for being liberal and tolerant, the society balances, modern, fast-paced urban life with strong, traditional roots in art, biking, and, in some regions, religious traditions. Key, defining, elements, include, a, modest, "just, act, normal", attitude, a, strong, work-life, balance, and a deep, appreciation for the arts.



Austria – Europe

Austrians are generally formal, polite, and value direct communication. A strict distinction between public and private life is maintained and residents often follow rules of propriety in public places. They love coffee houses for socializing. Also, they are avid sports enthusiasts as well as have a rich heritage for music.

Timeline & Traffic Patterns

- Record hotel occupancy expected
- Short-term rentals
- Heavy foot traffic near venues & entertainment districts/museums
- International visitors stay up to several days
- No estimate on spending habits but they will have money to spend

FIFA Fan Festival™ is official watch party – open 18 days and free to all – National WWI Museum and Memorial

Fan Movement Patterns

- Fans arrive early and stay late
- Peak traffic before and after matches
- Matches are in the evenings
- Fan Festival runs 18 days – expect much traffic
- Eating and shopping in specific areas
- Lite rail hop on hop off
- Shopping downtown and Kansas City Plaza

Marketing Strategies

Short-term: operations + conversion
(4-6 weeks) (minimal branding)

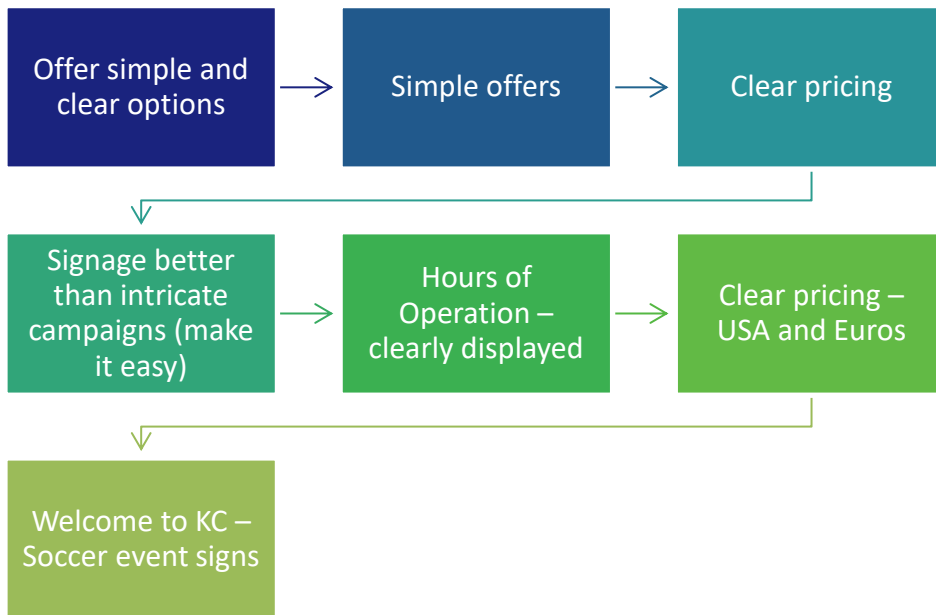
Long-term possibilities depending on

clear options



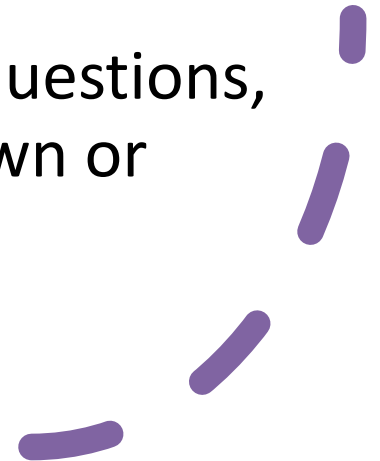
Clarity Beats Complexity



Operational Best Practices

- Fewer choices
- Faster payments
- Note: Customers will be reluctant to give you credit card
- Extended hours during matches
- Have enough staff for peak hours

If customers need to ask questions,
you've already slowed down or
killed sales



Payment Methods



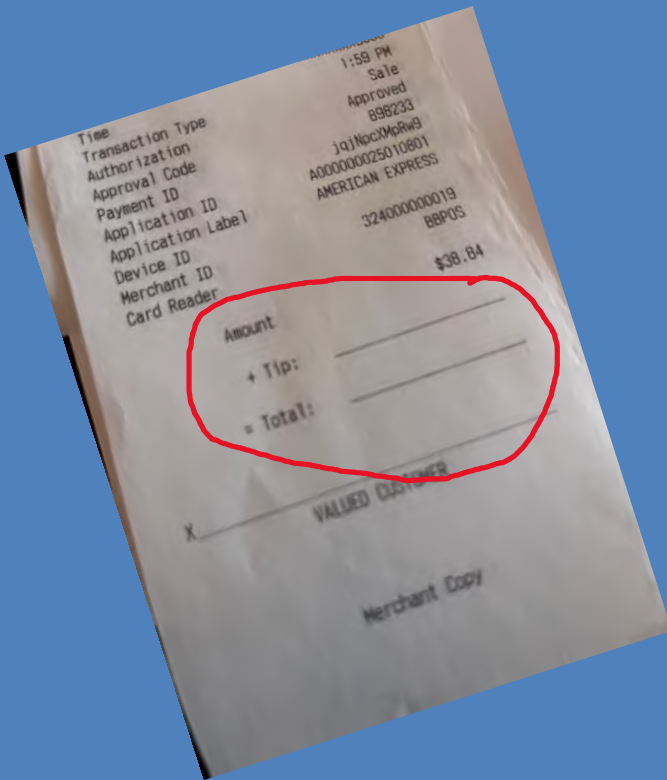
International Customers are used to “touchless” payments

Use portable payment machines or invite them to counter for payments



Tipping

Tipping "tips" – customary tips in USA so they know what is expected



Tipping Strategies

Understand the tipping culture of other countries

Implement auto-gratuity for tours/large parties in restaurants

Clear menu communication “service not included” printed on menus

Prepare for lower tips – balance server’s tables

Provide excellent service no matter what

Visitor-Friendly Touches



- Bathroom signage with visuals
- Public WiFi codes
- Water stations if possible
- Maps of district (where are they)
- Pricing strategy – offer bundles, menus with QR codes, special of the day
- Be a referral partner

Enough staff during peak hours

Staff training on cultural sensitivity and what to expect each day during this surge

International payment readiness

Soccer themed products or services

Extended hours

Best products visually front and center

Logistics & Operations

Supply chain readiness (inventory needs)

Transportation and parking impacts (how to find you)

Safety and security preparations – coordinate with your local municipality and law enforcement.

Insurance, Licensing and permits for special events/outdoor spaces

Pricing & Revenue Optimization

- Dynamic pricing for peak days
- Bundles and daily specials
- Balance profitability with brand reputation – (don't price gouge)
- Keep tipping in mind
- Pre-booking and reservation system – WhatsApp. Links to Open Table etc


