Requirements for viewing translated captions


- Zoom desktop app for Windows or macOS: [Global minimum version](#) or higher
- Zoom web app
- [Automated captions](#) and [translated captions enabled](#)*

***Note:** Translated captioning requires the host to be a member of a Zoom Workplace Business Plus, Zoom Workplace Enterprise Essentials, Zoom Workplace Enterprise Plus, or Zoom Workplace Enterprise Premier account, or assigned the Zoom Translated Captions add-on

How to view translated captions

Enable captions in a meeting or webinar

Any participant in the meeting or webinar can self-enable captions, as they are not dependent on the host to enable.



1. Join a Zoom [webinar](#).
2. In the meeting controls toolbar, click the **Show Captions** icon .

Note: You may have to click **More**, then click **Captions**.

Captions will appear above the controls toolbar. By default, English is set as the speaking language the captions are generated in.

Note: Users can also have the Zoom desktop app [automatically show captions](#), when available in the meeting or webinar.

Adjust closed captioning size

1. In the [meeting controls](#), next to the **Show Captions** icon, click the up arrow icon .
2. Under **Captions and translation**, click **Caption settings**.
The **Accessibility** desktop app settings window will appear.
3. Under **Closed captioning**, move the slider to adjust the caption font size .

Supported languages for translated captioning

The following languages are supported for translated captions and can be translated between most* of the listed languages: **Arabic**, Bengali, Cantonese, Chinese (Traditional), Chinese (Simplified), Czech, Danish, **Dutch**, English, Estonian, Finnish, French (Canada), **French (France)**, **German**, Hebrew, Hindi, Hungarian, Indonesian, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Malay, Persian, Polish, Portuguese, Romanian, Russian, **Spanish**, Swedish, Tagalog, Tamil, Telugu, Thai, Turkish, Ukrainian, and Vietnamese.

When viewing Recorded Videos via YouTube

YouTube's auto-translate feature allows viewers to translate video captions into their preferred language using Google Translate. To use it:

- **As a viewer:**
 - Click the **CC** (Closed Captions) icon to enable subtitles.
 - Click the **gear icon (⚙)** in the video player.
 - Select **Subtitles/CC**, then choose **Auto-translate** and pick your desired language.
 - The subtitles will be automatically translated in real time.
